

Palm Sunday - April 13: Celebration of Palms. *Please return Alms for Palms NOW Summer Lunch donation containers.*


Holy Thursday - April 17: Service will be at 7:00 p.m. where we will be celebrating Holy Communion in the upper room.

Christian Book Exchange


Greetings from the Book Exchange! Located next to the elevator in the narthex, our April highlight is **Where Do We Go From Here?**
