

# The Pastor's Pen

The past few months I have been stuck in ponder mode. I have really been focused on communion. I am not talking about the physical elements but the communing with others. Our faith, by design calls us to live and grow in a communal life. Now before you break out the old sandals and beads, we are not called to rush to a commune and pitch our tents and acoustic guitars and begin talking about "the man". To be a Christian means to embrace the simple notion that all of creation knitted together forms the body of Christ, the church. Looking around we can see how each person is uniquely created and gifted with many qualities. These unique blessings by design are essential to one another.

When we are fully embodied and rooted in the trust that God is doing something through us, we become the Body of Christ. Paul talked about this in his letter to the community in Corinth. In a community where everyone was trying to isolate themselves, creating hierarchies and tensions around gifts, Paul reminds them that they are all equally precious as diverse representations of God's sacred image.

Through my pondering I placed focus on those that chose to isolate themselves by placing focus only upon those who are just like them, in looks, actions, language, and lifestyle. Through this isolation some will miss the opportunity to embrace differing cultures, mindsets, language, and lifestyle of others in God's vast creation. Truly this is normal behavior throughout creation and history, and I believe that we do this out of comfort. Let's be honest no one like change and stepping across those lines we will have the opportunity to possibly experience something new, yet different than the norm.

Honestly, it is certainly more comfortable to be with folks who match the image in the mirror. When we ponder the broader community where our comforts are stretched and our ingrained biases are challenged – especially in a season where there seems to be lines drawn in the sand everywhere and polarization is quickly becoming the new normal of our society. Ironically, we can see and hear headlines about the increasing tendency towards anxiety, depression, and loneliness across all age categories.

Let us focus our future pondering on the teachings of Paul whose wisdom is essential for us to learn from. In a culture that seems to categorize people by their affiliations political, academic, industrial, or age – we may find a deeper health in honoring the diversity of affiliations in the expansive community that we call "The Church." As a church, we are called to stand in tension with the norms of our cultural moment, reminding one another that we have inherent value – and that the differences between us only help us to grow in our relationship with the creator of the universe. A truth that I want to embrace as we move towards the changing of the season and move quickly towards Advent and Christmas preparations. Each of every person in creation is created in the image and likeness of God the Creator. When we lose start to lose sight of that – living in direct competition with one another. We struggle with arguments of right and wrong, who is better or worse, who is financially successful and who is struggling, which political party is correct, and which one is wrong, we are simply dividing God's grand design for our own satisfactions. Ours is a communal life designed around faith, love, hope, and grace. To be Christian means to honor the lives of the people around us as though Christ may be represented in them.

## Care News from Stephen Ministry

# Robinson First United Methodist Church will Commission Stephen Ministers

On Sunday, September 14, 2025 during our church service, we will commission seven new Stephen Ministers. They are: Bonnie Banks, Kayla Holscher, Sarah Kennedy, Karen Laflin, Mick Laflin, Diana Woodworth, and Stephanie Townsend.

These seven people have been through 50 hours of specialized training in Christian caregiving and join a team of Stephen Ministers at Robinson First United Methodist Church. Stephen Ministers provide confidential, one-to-one Christian care to people experiencing a crisis or going through a difficult time. Stephen Ministers meet weekly with their care receiver for around an hour to listen, care, encourage, pray, and provide emotional and spiritual support for the person. Caring relationships last for as long as the person's need persists.

The training sessions were taught by our Stephen Leaders: Linda Null, Janelle Oxford, and Marcia Schmidlin. Our church's Stephen Ministers also participated and contributed to the training sessions. Our current Stephen Ministers are: Kaye Albin, Gary Oxford, Antje Pippin, and Lois Ulrey.

Please lift up our new Stephen Ministers in your prayers, asking that God bless their ministry and work through them to bring hope and healing to those they will serve. Pray also for the continued ministry of Robinson First United Methodist Church's other Stephen Ministers.

Our congregation is one of more than 13,000 worldwide, representing 160 Christian denominations, that use the Stephen Series system of lay caring ministry developed by Stephen Ministries in St. Louis.


