From the Pastor's Pen

So then, with endurance, let's also run the race that is laid out in front of us, since we have such a great cloud of witnesses surrounding us. Let's throw off any extra baggage, get rid of the sin that trips us up, (Hebrews 12:1 CEB)

Well there is something to be said about having endurance. These past several months have been a journey that many of us would like to never travel again. In fact, these past few years seem like we are running a marathon - uphill, against the wind, carrying your over-weight friend, who is carrying a bowling ball - on your back. The amazing thing is that the finish line of this God-forsaken race is off in the distance, and every time we feel we are close to the finish, someone moves the line.

When we read the above passage, we can identify with the author who paints such a vivid picture of the race that has been laid out before each of us. As Christians we are reminded of those who have completed the journey and now celebrate their eternal reward. But, let us focus on those in the shadows watching us. These folks are curious about the race and are wanting to be in the race as well. When we encourage them to set out on their own spiritual races, we are providing them opportunity for "hope" while they are already receiving "grace and love".

So, to quote Sawyer Brown, "The race is on!" Let us finish this year with our heads held high. Folks, we are running but our faith is what is carrying us each day. Lace up those running / walking shoes, grab the word of God on the way out the door, and let's encourage others to get into the race.

Care News from Stephen Ministry

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God." - Philippians 4:6

Do you ever struggle with feelings of apprehension, worry, nervousness, or anxiety? Do you sometimes experience mental and emotional exhaustion? Let's be honest, we all do. During a recent Stephen Ministry meeting, Janelle Oxford shared a devotion with the Stephen Ministers about anxiety and how Christians can use scripture and prayer to deal with these emotions.

- Anxiety is a mental and physical reaction to perceived threats. In small doses, anxiety is helpful. It protects us from danger, and focuses our attention on problems. But when anxiety is too severe, or occurs too frequently, it can become debilitating (Therapist Aid).
- Anxiety works on a very "primitive" level. It has a physical component which can be counteracted by using a physical remedy.
- In Genesis, God's Holy Spirit breathed life into Adam when God formed him from the dust. We can remember that God's Holy Spirit that lives in us also gives us life through our breath. Therefore, we can remember that our breath is one way we are connected with God. Remember this can help us when we feel overly anxious or battle ongoing anxiety.
- Using prayerful meditation called breathing prayer, as soon as we feel the signs of anxiety, we can call on God to help ease our anxious moments and bring us His peace.

Breathing Prayer Examples:

Close your eyes and inhale through your nose slowly, imagine pulling the Spirit in so completely that it fills your entire body. Make sure your stomach expands: you will want to be filled with peace. Exhale slowly through your mouth.

While inhaling: While exhaling:

Come Holy Spirit fill my heart

Lord Jesus grant me your peace

Lord Jesus I love you
