The NOW Program began in January 2013 as a response to a growing population of at-risk children in the Robinson School District. Our threepronged approach allows students (who are identified by school staff) to receive meals on weekends throughout the school year, lunches three times per week in the summer, and a strong start to the school year. The NOW Program is funded by the congregation of First United Methodist Church and several community partners.

STEPHEN MINISTRY

Stephen Ministry is a lay care-giving ministry that supplements pastoral care. The program teaches laypersons to provide one-on-one care for individuals who request support. The confidential care-giver and care-receiver relationship, usually conducted by hour-long weekly visits, may continue for months or years. Stephen Ministers receive 50 hours of training led by Stephen Leaders, and at FUMC Stephen Leaders are Pastor Jay Regennitter, Janis Daugherty, Janelle Oxford, and Marcia Schmidlin. The SLs were commissioned during worship on August 18, and the training of Stephen Ministers began August 24.
