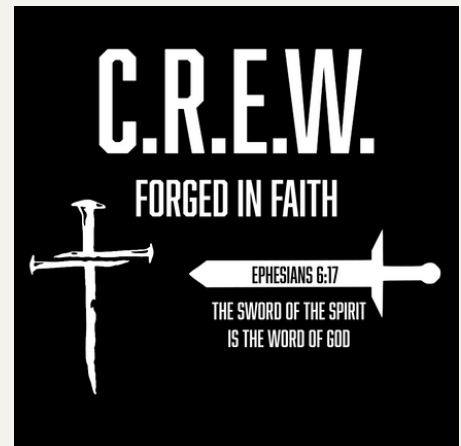

CARE NEWS FROM STEPHEN MINISTRY

Two are better than one because they have a good return for their hard work. If either should fall, one can pick up the other. But how miserable are those who fall and don't have a companion to help them up! Ecclesiastes 4:9-10

You should call a friend right now for many good reasons.....

- Texting and emails have their place, but a phone call is far more likely to convey warmth and affection. If you want the person to know you truly care, a text just won't do it.

- Inflections and tones in conversations are important. If you have ever received an email that was written in all capital letters, you probably thought the sender was shouting at you. Right?
- Gifts, memes, emojis, and other fun little graphics make digital communication fun. But, a phone call is more meaningful.
- According to Irina Firstein, LCSW, a therapist in New York City, calling is simply more personal and informative than texting. "It's a much richer way to understand another's internal experience," she explains. When we read a text or email, we interpret the message, and we may not pick up on what the other person is truly communicating.
- Firstein also suggests making a "call list". If you haven't talked with someone recently, simply give your friend a call. It's a win-win for you and your friend.

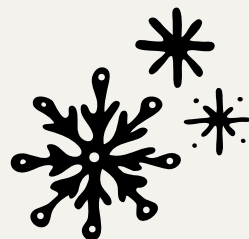
